## LECTURES - DESCRIPTION

### 1 LINGUISTICS – GRAMMAR – PHILOLOGY

### 2 SOURCES AND PROPERTIES OF HUMAN LANGUAGE

Features of language – productivity, duality, arbitrariness, discreteness, interchangeability, displacement; cultural transmission, freedom from stimulus control, spoken and written forms of language (biological, historical, functional, structural priorities of the spoken form).

### 3 LANGUAGE AS A SYSTEM OF SIGNS AND ITS STRUCTURE

Linguistic sign, Saussure's approach, features of linguistic sign – arbitrariness, discontinuity, and linearity, Ogden & Richard's semiotic triangle (signification, designation, denotation), difference between the denotative and the connotative meanings (factors affecting connotation – territorial, social, stylistic, temporal), Peirce's approach to sign, type – token relation.

### 4 FUNCTIONS OF LANGUAGE

### 5 LANGUAGE LEVELS; PHONETICS AND PHONOLOGY

The position of phonetics and phonology in the system. Phonology – phoneme, four different approaches to the notion of phoneme (mentalistic [ideal sound], physical [family of sounds with phonetic similarity and complementary distribution], functional view [distinctive features], abstract view [morphological alternations, distribution]. Trubetzkoy's theory of oppositions, distinctive features, permanent features and neutralizable features; facultative and combinatory variants, binary principle, marked vs. unmarked; kinds of opposition the notion of archiphoneme.

### 6 MORPHOLOGY

The place of morphology within the system, interfaces, units of morphology, the definition of morpheme, phonologically conditioned allomorphs, umlaut (i-umlaut, palatal umlaut) – its historical sources, and the ModE remnants, portmanteau morphs, zero morpheme, empty morph, diamorph, suppletion, the problem of cranberry morphs, inflectional and derivational morphemes – differences, functions, types of derivational morphems, affixes, prefixes, suffixes, infixes, transfixes, circumfixes; interfixes. Morphological models. Categories, the ontological and the syntactic bases for the delimitation of word-classes, classification of word-classes (Plato and Aristotle (Adj in Verbs) vs. Alexandrians (Adj in nouns), the notion of categorial transition, conversion, vague boundary between verbs and adjectives.

Word-formation, relationship between word-formation and inflectional morphology, semasiological and onomasiological methods and their objectives, terminology, synchronic and diachronic methods., the notion of WF syntagma, moneme, determinant-determinatum, zero-morpheme, Word-formation processes, compounding, types of compounds, prefixation, suffixation, infixation, conversion, back-formation, blending; the status of acronyms, clippings, and borrowings; word-manufacture, calques

### 7 LEXICAL LEVEL

Lexical level, structural relations among lexical units – hyponymy, polysemy, homonymy, antonymy, synonymy, lexical (semantic) fields, semantic changes (specialization (restriction) and generalization (extension) of meaning, transfer of meaning (metaphor, metonymy).

## 8 SYNTACTIC LEVEL

Functional Sentence Perspective, Theme, Rheme, Transition (temporal and modal exponents of the verb), communicative dynamism, the role of context, articles, subjective and objective ordering of T and R; FSP and word-order, passive constructions, emotive principle and word-order.

TG grammar – its basic features – mentalistic, universal rules, competence of an ideal speaker-hearer, performance, rules of generation of sentences, mathematical methods – formalization, description of phrase structure, IC, ultimate constituents, bracketing and structural ambiguity, rewrite rules, tree diagram, branch, node, phrase-marker as a labeled bracketing associated with the terminal string, kernel string and kernel sentence, definition of the kernel sentence, transformation rules, deep and surface structure.

Development of the English grammar system from the synthetic to the analytical type of language: analytic trends, word-order, Possessive Case and its adjectivization, the status of word in Modern English – a vague boundary between word and word-group, comparison of the function of affixes in English and Slovak

### SEMINARS

The main aim of the seminars is to develop students' knowledge of the linguistic terms and concepts introduced on lectures. The great emphasis will be placed on the ability to understand and to use the key terminology, since this course prepares students for future advanced courses in linguistics.

Class time will be spent working through students' responses to various questions related to lectures as well as to the texts students will be asked to read before attending class. Topics of the seminars will follow the content of the Introduction to Linguistics. A practical Coursebook.

For every session, your preparation (that is, readings, key terms, and journal entries) must be done BEFORE coming to class. Also, you are asked to do the readings first, as they are meant to provide you with food for thought. In addition to the required readings, you are also required to study key terms using Oxford Guide to British and American Culture as your reference book. After you've done this, it is time to reflect on what you've read/studied and sum up your thoughts in a journal entry.

Journal entries are required for each of the four sessions. You will receive five points for each journal entry you write. Showing up for class without your journal entry will count as 0 points for the journal entry. Journal entries will always be checked at the beginning of our session so make sure you keep them somewhere handy. Should you happen to miss a class, make sure you present the instructor with the journal entry for the session together with the next session's at the beginning of your next session if you want it to count. A minimum of 15 points for journal entries is necessary if you wish to sign up for the exam. Using another person's journal entry as your own results in an immediate FX for the course.

What your journal entries should be is basically your thoughtful/critical reflections on the things you've read for the upcoming session. If it helps, think of these as if they were blog posts -- in printed form -- reacting to the readings and/or key terms for the week. Each journal entry should be at least 500 words long (typed on an A4-sized sheet in Times New Roman, 12pt, double-spaced, with your name in the top right corner and journal entry number/heading centered in bold at the start of the page), which means there is no way you can touch on every aspect of what you've read. Instead, I recommend that you choose a more narrow issue or a few specifics to comment on, making sure these are somehow connected in writing. Also, make sure that your entry is divided into paragraphs in a logical manner (for instructions on how to write, grab any Writing Handbook available).

In terms of topics, your first and your last journal entry should be about your perceptions of the USA before and after taking this course, respectively; while the journal entries in between will reflect on your readings.

Lastly -- and this cannot be stressed enough -- the readings, key terms and journal entries are instrumental in making the class a dynamic in-depth exploration. Your consistent preparation is, therefore, necessary.

- CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT – Language skills 2 ( LS2 ) as a subject comprises 5 parts (1-reading, 2- speaking, 3- listening, 4- vocabulary, 5- grammar). Students will take 2 credit tests, Test 1 on April, 22 and Test 2 on May, 6. All five parts of the subject will be included in the tests and they will be tested on the same day; however, each part will be considered separately. At the end of the semester, within each part of LS2 separately, your partial scores will be calculated based on the results of partial credit tests. In order to pass one part of LS2, you need to score 65% minimum as a sum of both partial credit tests.

Class attendance

Students are expected to attend each class according to the schedule. Transfers among the groups are possible. In case you miss one class you are required to attend the class with a different group or excuse your absence with a valid doctor's certificate. In case you miss more than two classes, you will not receive credits for the course. You must be on time for class. Should you miss the first ten minutes of a particular seminar session your presence in the class will not count.

Preparation

Students are expected to make their own copies of the required materials and complete the assigned tasks and exercises. Should you fail to bring your own copy of the required study materials or a completed home assignment for a particular seminar, your presence in class will not count. If you arrange with the tutor in advance not to attend a class session, you will be expected to submit any assignment on the subsequent session.

The first credit test will take place on the first tutorial week, between the 2nd and the 5th of November. The second credit test will take place during the second tutorial period between the 13th and the 23rd of December. The pass level is 65 points from the two tests together. The tests will include grammar, reading and vocabulary exercises similar to those done during the seminar sessions. There will be NO RETAKE TEST.

The course concludes with an oral exam where a special emphasis is placed on fluency, range of ACADEMIC vocabulary, precise use of English idioms and collocations in academic context, and the presentation and communication skills of the students. The exam consists of two parts:

1. After a short period of preparation (2-3 minutes) the student is required to speak about one of the discussed course TOPICS for approximately 5-7 minutes. The topics are randomly selected.
2. The students are required to lead an academic discussion with the examiner about the selected topic and must be able to answer questions, explain, quote, give examples and present other speaking skills for approximately 5-7 minutes.

Passing the oral exam the student can gain 100 points total:

- 25 points for FLUENCY AND ABILITY TO SPONTANEOUSLY REACT
- 25 points for CORRECT GRAMMAR AND USE OF ENGLISH
- 25 points for RANGE OF VOCABULARY (ACADEMIC EXPRESSIONS, COLLOCATIONS)
- 25 points for PRONUNCIATION, VOICE AND PRESENTATION SKILLS
