Learning outcomes: The aim of the course is to acquire knowledge of political, economic, cultural history and development of social structure of the states in the Near East, in Egypt and the Aegean area based on specialized literature and primary historical sources.	
Brief outline of the course: 1. Introduction to study of history of Prehistory – content of subject, periodization, territorial delimitation, specialized literature. 2. The oldest states in Mesopotamia – character and basic features of the Sumerian civilization, Epic of Gilgamesh. 3. Old Babylonian Empire – the reign of Hammurabi, social structure of inhabitants – Hammurabi 's Code. 4. Political and economic development in Assyria and Syria in the 3rd and 2nd millennium B.C. – the Old Assyrian Empire, the Middle Assyrian Empire, the Neo-Assyrian Empire. 5. Establishment of civilization and formation of the state in Egypt - periodization, the Old Empire and Middle Empire. Development of political, economic and social structure of population. 6. New empire in Egypt – political and social development, the reign of Akhenaten – religious reform and its consequences, dynasty of Ramesses. Late Empire in Egypt. 7. Asia Minor in the 3rd and 2nd millennium B.C. and formation of the Hittite Empire – political development of the Empire and specific features of the Hittite civilization. “Maritime Nations” – the Phrygians and Lydians. 8. Syria, Phoenicia and Palestine in the 3rd and 2nd millennium B.C. – establishment of Phoenician city-states, their political, economic and social development. 9. The Aegean area v 3rd and 2nd millennium B.C. – emergence of the Minoan civilization on Crete and the Mycenaean civilisation on continental Greece, Greek mythology. 10. Neo-Babylonian Empire – political history, organization of state and social differentiation of population.	

11. The Medes and Persians – political formation of the Median and Persian Empire, economic and social development.
12. Greco-Persian wars.

Conditions for course completion: Preparation of two seminar papers of required quality elaborated on the basis of specialized literature and presented by a student during exercise + presentation in ppt. (at least 10 slides). The paper should consist of at least 5 standard pages (1.5 lining, TIMES NEW ROMAN, 12), however, it should not have more than 10 standard pages, it must contain notes and bibliography. Active participation in seminar-preparation for individual seminars by means of studying the text assigned in advance. Final written test.	
Learning outcomes: The aim of the course is to present the history of the "long" 19th century from the French Revolution (1789) to the First World War (1914-1918), in political, social and cultural connections. The priorities include development of European great powers and especially development of their political system, history of great ideological systems of the 19th century, history of symbolical aspects of revolutions, history of intellectual movements and cultural institutions with political importance. The course also involves analysis of basic terms connected with the 19th century, i.e. revolution, secularization, nationalism, imperialism, liberalism, feminism. The course is primarily focused on development in Europe and USA, but also other issues of development on the Far East, dissolution of the Ottoman Empire or decolonization of Africa will be discussed. The course graduates will be able to understand basic development trends of the 19th century and to interpret also new definitions and issues connected with this period.	
Brief outline of the course: The French Revolution as a phenomenon of European history of Modern Era (Causes of crisis of the French society, stages and course of the French Revolution) The Napoleonic Era in the history of France, division of the world after the Congress of Vienna in 1814-1815 Development in Europe in 1815 – 1848 (particularities of the so-called "Metternich" system, establishment and activities of the Holy Alliance, events of 1830s and 1840s in Europe, liberation movements in Serbia and Greece). Decline of the Ottoman Empire in the 19th century (Demonstrations of timar-sipahi system crisis, reforms of Sultan Selim III (1761 – 1808), the Tanzimat period (1839–1876). The Eastern question	

at the end of Modern Era (the Third Balkan Crisis (1875-1879), Congress of Berlin and the Bosnian Crisis).

Revolutionary years 1848 - 1849 (revolutionary years and their causes and consequences for development of European continent, description of revolutions in individual countries).

Historical development of the Far East in 1839 – 1905 (involvement of great powers and division of influence, the so-called “Opium Wars”, Sino-French war, Meiji reforms in Japan, Sino-Japanese war, "Boxer" Rebellion in China, Russo-Japanese war).

Development in USA in the 19th century – on the road to isolationism + causes, course and results of civil war in the USA (1861-1865)

The end of colonial division of the world and attempts at its new division (Dissolution of Spanish colonial domination on American continent, Characteristics of colonial division of the world at the end of the 19th century, fighting for colonies in Africa at the end of the 19th century and at the beginning of the 20th century).
