Learning outcomes: The aim of the course is to introduce the history of the French Revolution (1789-1799), which from its beginning was considered the most important event of the century with far-reaching consequences. During the Revolution a new social order was formed and the French state was reorganized. The French Revolution brought to the historical science not only a plenty of information, famous persons, but also a whole range of problems of how to capture, understand and evaluate a spectrum of changes which came into existence during and in connection with the French Revolution. The massive political wave reached all aspects of everyday life, formed the language, traditions and all human activities. The Revolution and its value system significantly influenced the life of citizens, and from revolutionary everydayness of France, in the sequence of events and changes, a new civil society emerged. What was typical for it? Why was it so specific? At the end of this course students will be able to understand and explain the character and specific features of modern French society, its identity and culture. Reflection of the French Revolution in art, literature and film and also Napoleon Bonaparte, a famous person arisen in revolutionary French Republic on the battlefield, make an integral part of this course. It showed a new direction to the French society and also significantly affected at the beginning of modern era the historical development of the entire Europe. It foreshadowed development of events in individual European states in the 19th century.	
Brief outline of the course: French society in the 18th century – beginnings of political and economic crisis. Spiritual situation of French society, the Enlightenment, encyclopaedists, establishment of revolutionary philosophy – direct preconditions for outbreak of the French Revolution. Symbolism of period of the French	

Revolution. Character of French absolutism during the reign of Louis XVI., government machinery, throwbacks of local self-governments, judicial system, increase of state debt. Assembly of the Estates General in 1789, legal, political and economic conflicts between absolutism and the Third Estate. Outbreak of the French Revolution – 14th July 1789, revolution in the country, rebellions in cities and in villages. Issues of periodization of the French Revolution. Victory of the people of Paris.
