Learning outcomes:

The main goal of the course is to acquaint students with cognitive psychology, as a scientific discipline that deals with the study of human cognition, and to provide them with the current knowledge related to human cognition. In addition, the course also emphasizes the ability to properly understand this knowledge and apply it. For this purpose, the course provides not only an overview of the main theories of selected cognitive processes and the broader context of the discipline but also practical illustrations and systematic encouragement of critical thinking. The main goal of seminars is to train the ability to use and adequately present the acquired knowledge, connect this knowledge to other related areas, think about it independently, discuss it critically and, last but not least, to flexiblty and cretively solve various related model activities.

Brief outline of the course:

The content of the course is based on current knowledge of psychology, especially health psychology and counseling psychology and psychological research in the field of prevention of risk behavior related to health. Teaching is realized by a combination of lectures with an engaging explanation of lecturers from practice and interactive, experiential methods, discussion and open communication with mutual respect, support of independence, activity and motivation of students. The topics of the workshops provide information on psychological, pedagogical, medical and forensic aspects of the prevention of substance abuse and risky behavior.

The aim of participation in the training part of the course is to gain information about prevention and experience with preventive activities, with its various forms and strategies, specifically information about dissemination of information in prevention, affective education, social impact, normative expectations, peer programs, life skills in prevention (such as rejection abilities, pressure resistance, assertive abilities, coping abilities, etc.).

The aim of the management of block activities by students is to gain experience in leading preventive activities in the group as well as to develop the competencies of the lecturer.
