The course is focused on gaining basic knowledge of regional analysis - spatial structure and its impact on regional development, factors of regional development and causes of regional disparities, importance, object of regional analysis, source data for regional analysis and creation of basic regional overviews, classification of methods and spatial analysis techniques. Selected methods of regional analysis, which enable to solve the most common tasks in regional development - methods useful for solving localization tasks (eg localization CVP analysis, point method), methods of concentration analysis (eg industry density and intensity, location quotient and indicators derived from it), methods applicable for evaluation of socio-economic development (direct and indirect methods of measuring and comparing the level of regional development, selected quantitative techniques (IO analysis, regression analysis, CBA analysis), selected qualitative techniques (benchmarking, SWOT analysis, case studies, questionnaires).
