The last block focuses on migration, the process of acculturation and the network of intercultural cities.

Students have to work out a semester work during the semester, which will be continuously presented. The thesis presents a selected social problem in a particular selected locality (town, municipality) and applies the potential of a social enterprise to it. They have a maximum of 20 points for their work. Minimum 11 points.

The student can get a total of 40 points for the credit. To pass the exam, the student needs to achieve at least 21 points in the credit. If the student does not achieve the minimum number of credit points (21 points), it is possible to write corrective written examination in the 13th week of the semester. Exam: student can get max. 60 points, min. 31 points. The points from the credit are added to them. In total, the student can obtain 100 points from the course.

Tolerated absence: 100% attendance at seminars is required.

### **Learning outcomes:**

The aim of the course is to understand the principles of social economy and social entrepreneurship, to understand the importance of social entrepreneurship with respect to the social needs of society at home and abroad. It is a new modern and highly up-to-date subject that can create space for finding solutions to problems of unemployment or disadvantaged citizens in society and at the same time to prepare students for the establishment of new social enterprises in regions that need this kind of business. By excursion in social enterprises / external lectures, the student gets a real idea of what a social enterprise looks like, how it is managed and what role it performs in local communities.
