The mid-term exam, midterm test and presentation on a given topic are not conditional on obtaining a minimum number of points. However, it is necessary to reach min. 30 points. In case the student does not get the necessary min. The number of points (30) required to advance to the exam is entitled to 1 corrective exam. In this revision, it must reach min. 30 points (out of 50). If the student does not meet these conditions, he / she cannot proceed to the examination.

If the student fulfills the conditions for passing the exam (min. 30 and max 50 points during the semester), these will be added to the number of points obtained in the written exam, which consists of a test of 50 questions, each of 1 point / total. -50 points. Here it is necessary to achieve at least 21 points (21 + 30 - minimum number of points for the exam and semester = 51 points) which is an "E" rating).

Presentation in pwp is always on a specified topic given at the beginning of the semester with a schedule of presentation at the first or second seminar. It is attended by 2 students. The originality of processing (formal and content), clarity, brevity, accuracy, visibility-resolution, interestingness are evaluated. It is also important to select the relevant processing sources, which must be at least 5. Duration of at least 10, maximum 15 minutes, the student submits one presentation carrier marked with the names of the students who are the authors.

Learning outcomes:

To acquaint students with characteristics of social policy, principles, functions, theoretical and ideological concepts in theory and application to practice. Emphasis is placed on understanding social policy both as a scientific discipline and as a practical activity, which focuses not only on the problems of social security of the population against the negative social consequences of the economic and political transformation process, but also on policies with significant reactivation stimulative and developmental aspects. This course also aims to synthesize knowledge from already completed subjects of social policy, sociology, law, political science and economics, both in theoretical and practical areas.

These characteristics of SP are applied in the course to selected current problematic social events in the framework of employment policy, health policy, housing and family policy, especially in Slovakia.

The mid-term exam, midterm test and presentation on a given topic are not conditional on obtaining a minimum number of points. However, it is necessary to achieve min. 30 points. In case the student does not get the necessary min. The number of points (30) required to advance

to the exam is entitled to 1 corrective exam. In this revision, it must reach min. 30 points (out of 50). If the student fails to meet these conditions, he / she cannot proceed to the examination (X is evaluated).

If a student fulfills the conditions for passing the exam (min. 30 and max 50 points during the semester), they are added to the number of points obtained in the written exam, which consists of a test of 50 questions, each of 1 point / total. -50 points. Here it is necessary to achieve at least 21 points (21 + 30 - minimum number of points for the exam and semester = 51 points) which is an "E" rating).

Presentation in pwp is always on a specified topic given at the beginning of the semester with a schedule of presentation at the first or second seminar. 2 students participate (depending on the number of students in the seminar group and the decision of the training teacher). The originality of processing (formal and content), clarity, brevity, accuracy, visibility-resolution, interestingness are evaluated. It is also important to select the relevant processing sources, which must be at least 5. Duration of at least 10, maximum 15 minutes, the student submits one presentation carrier marked with the names of the students who are the authors.

The student is obliged to attend seminar exercises prepared in terms of syllabuses. If it is not ready, it can be scored with a minus point as well, if it is ready, it will be scored with plus points, which are added to the total for the semester.

Students are required to participate 100% in seminars. For each absence in seminars the teacher determines substitute written performance. Up to 3 absences can be replaced. Addition: the teacher assesses, based on the severity of the absence, whether he / she determines the written performance or justifies the student's absence without written performance.
