During the semester, students take a knowledge test and a final knowledge test.

If the teaching is carried out in a classical way - face-to-face form of teaching. The discipline presents an overview of more specialized philosophical topics and works that influenced the development of disciplines such as psychology and social work. Students will acquire basic terminology from philosophy by studying source texts of periods of the history of philosophy in relation to the discipline of their field of study. The student acquires the ability for a deeper understanding of historical events, where the emphasis is placed on critical thinking with an emphasis on self-knowledge.
