100% participation in seminars is required from students. For each non-participation in the seminars, the teacher will determine a substitute written performance. A maximum of 3 absences can be replaced. Addendum: the teacher will assess, based on the seriousness of the reason for non-participation, whether he will determine written compliance or excuse the student's non-participation without written compliance.

The midterm written examination and midterm test nor the presentation on the specified topic are not conditional on obtaining a minimum number of points. However, a minimum of 30 points must be achieved when the individual sub-conditions are added together. If the student does not obtain the minimum number of points (30) required to progress to the examination, he/she is entitled to 1 remedial written examination. In this remedial examination, the student must achieve a minimum of 30 points /out of 50/. If the student fails to meet these conditions, he/she cannot progress to the examination (he/she is graded X).

If the student fulfils the conditions for advancement to the examination (min. 30 and max. 50 points from the continuous performance during the semester), these are added to the number of points obtained in the written examination, which consists of a test of 50 questions, where each question is worth 1 point /total-50 points/. The mid-term exam, midterm test and presentation on a given topic are not conditional on obtaining a minimum number of points. However, it is necessary to achieve min. 30 points. In case the student does not get the necessary min. The number of points (30) required to advance to the exam is entitled to 1 corrective exam. It is also important to select the relevant processing sources, which must be at least 5. Duration of at least 10, maximum 15 minutes. the student submits one presentation carrier marked with the names of the students who are the authors.

The student is obliged to attend seminar exercises prepared in terms of syllabuses. If it is not ready, it can be scored with a minus point as well, if it is ready, it will be scored with plus points, which are added to the total for the semester.

Students are required to participate 100% in seminars. For each absence in seminars the teacher determines substitute written performance. Up to 3 absences can be replaced. Addition: the teacher assesses, based on the severity of the absence, whether he / she determines the written performance or justifies the student's absence without written performance.
