The aim of the course is to understand the principles of functioning of social economy and social entrepreneurship, to understand the importance of social entrepreneurship with regard to the social needs of society at home and abroad.

It is a new modern and highly topical subject that can create space for finding solutions to the problems of disadvantaged citizens in society and at the same time be a preparation for students to establish new social enterprises in regions that need this kind of entrepreneurship. By excursion in social enterprises / lecture by an external lecturer, the student gets a real idea of what a social enterprise looks like, how it is managed and what role it plays in local communities.

Through the elaboration of a term paper, the student: independently solves problem tasks in predictable changing conditions, recognizes the emergence of a problem in the selected locality (village, city), monitors, analyzes and evaluates a specific procedure for establishing a social enterprise, proposes specific working procedures, which assumes innovative and creative thinking. The student learns to think critically, independently and analytically in unpredictable changing conditions. In doing so, it takes into account social, scientific and ethical aspects in the direction of

the development of society, how the social enterprise will positively influence the site. It will have the ability to present results and formulate recommendations for the development of the area.
