## **Learning outcomes:**

The aim of the course is to present the history of the "long" 19th century from the French Revolution (1789) to the First World War (1914-1918), in political, social and cultural connections. The priorities include development of European great powers and especially development of their political system, history of great ideological systems of the 19th century, history of symbolical aspects of revolutions, history of intellectual movements and cultural institutions with political importance. The course also involves analysis of basic terms connected with the 19th century, i.e. revolution, secularization, nationalism, imperialism, liberalism, feminism. The course is primarily focused on development in Europe and USA, but also other issues of development on the Far East, dissolution of the Ottoman Empire or decolonization of Africa will be discussed. The course graduates will be able to understand basic development trends of the 19th century and to interpret also new definitions and issues connected with this period.

#### Brief outline of the course:

The French Revolution as a phenomenon of European history of Modern Era (Causes of crisis of the French society, stages and course of the French Revolution)

The Napoleonic Era in the history of France, division of the world after the Congress of Vienna in 1814-1815

Development in Europe in 1815 – 1848 (particularities of the so-called "Metternich" system, establishment and activities of the Holy Alliance, events of 1830s and 1840s in Europe, liberation movements in Serbia and Greece).

Decline of the Ottoman Empire in the 19th century (Demonstrations of timar-sipahi system crisis, reforms of Sultan Selim III (1761 – 1808), the Tanzimat period (1839–1876). The Eastern question

at the end of Modern Era (the Third Balkan Crisis (1875-1879), Congress of Berlin and the Bosnian Crisis).

Revolutionary years 1848 - 1849 (revolutionary years and their causes and consequences for development of European continent, description of revolutions in individual countries).

Historical development of the Far East in 1839 – 1905 (involvement of great powers and division of influence, the so-called "Opium Wars", Sino-French war, Meiji reforms in Japan, Sino-Japanese war, "Boxer" Rebellion in China, Russo-Japanese war).

Development in USA in the 19th century – on the road to isolationism + causes, course and results of civil war in the USA (1861-1865)

The end of colonial division of the world and attempts at its new division (Dissolution of Spanish colonial domination on American continent, Characteristics of colonial division of the world at the end of the 19th century, fighting for colonies in Africa at the end of the 19th century and at the beginning of the 20th century).
