The instructor can award the student plus points, but also minus points, for the activity at the seminar, if the student is not ready for the lesson according to the schedule of duties for individual seminar exercises in syllabi.

In the event that the teaching takes place online, students present according to the date agreed in 1 week online to MS teams within the seminar, the presentations are then sent to the e-mail richard.geffert@upjs.sk.

In this case, it is necessary to provide a verbal description, a paper, a commentary on each part of the presentation, up to 10 standard pages, for the presentation in PWP. Students are informed about all the requisites of the presentation and the report on it, formal, but above all content, at 1 meeting, they may write any questions to the appropriate e-mail, always from the official student account at UPJŠ.
