Learning outcomes:

The aim of the subject is to increase students' financial literacy. The subject is focused on banking and insurance as part of the national economy, it defines the legislative framework of these industries. Students will have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the organization of the banking system in Slovakia, with the position of the National Bank of Slovakia, the Central European Bank, as well as other banks in the market system. Using specific examples, they will learn to use payment instruments, they will have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the basic steps and documentation for concluding credit agreements. The aim of the course is also to make students understand how the single insurance market works, to learn how to navigate insurance products and industries.

- 10. New trends in the Slovak insurance industry. Characteristics of life and non-life insurance. Contractual and statutory insurance. Liability insurance.
- 11. Collateral and its meaning.
- 12. Bancassurance causes and reasons for its creation. Specific bancassurance products.
- 13. Final summary of the discussed issues.
