Learning outcomes: The condition for the award of a grade is active participation in classes and obtaining a sufficient number of points for the interim assessment (term paper) and the final assessment (final semester-long test). The final grade for the course will be calculated based on the sum of the scores of the midterm and final assessments. The primary idea of the course is to highlight the ideological, cultural, and political dimensions of society within totalitarian and democratic regimes, with a focus on their vulnerabilities and their potential for transformation into their counterparts. The course also focuses on the position of democratic and totalitarian regimes in the context of the international system.
