The student is allowed a maximum of two absences. In the case of more than two absences, the student does not meet the requirements for successful completion of the course. In the event of any attendance problems, the student shall, on his/her own initiative, contact the instructor with information about his/her absence.

The course is taught primarily in a face-to-face format, supplemented by distance learning tools. Opportunity to earn points towards the grade for activity during class.

Continuous assessment:

The continuous assessment of the course consists of two levels. First, students will participate in analyses and evaluations of the political communication of selected domestic and foreign political actors with the participation and moderation of the instructor. The activity will take place twice per semester, with an emphasis on analyzing the elements and tools of direct and indirect communication, recognizing communication techniques, and identifying media strategies. Students may earn a total of 10 points on the first level of the interim assessment.

Students will also prepare independent outcomes related to activities analyzing and shaping political communication five times per semester. These will be uploaded to the lms.upjs.sk platform on the relevant course page (below). They will also present their outputs in seminars. Students can earn a total of 10 points in the second level of the continuous assessment.

The continuous assessment thus consists of a total of 20 points (min. 12 points). Completion of the mid-term assessment is a condition for admission to the course examination. In the event that the student does not attend the seminar at which he/she is to present the selected topic, he/she is obliged to notify the course lecturers of this fact and to arrange an alternative assignment. The student has the opportunity to earn points towards the grade for activity during class.

The course is taught primarily in a face-to-face format, supplemented by distance learning tools. Final Assessment:

The final assessment will take the form of a simulated student output on a pre-selected topic. The student may receive 10 points (min. 6 points) from the final assessment. The output will simulate a public press conference. The specified time for one output is approximately 8-10 minutes.

There will be four basic levels assessed in the outputs:

- -Content of the speech and topic (interestingness and conception of the topic, how the student works with factuality, appeal to emotion, how he/she combines information, what conclusions he/she draws, etc.)
- The form of the speech (adaptation of the topic and rhetoric to the audience, expression, logical structure of the speech, etc.)
- Eye contact, presentation (how the student works with verbal and non-verbal tools of communication, persuasiveness of the output)
- Ability to interact with the speaker (asking questions, ability to respond to the delivered output from the perspective of the journalistic community)

Each output will be followed by a space for questions to which the speaker should be able to respond. The student may earn a total of 10 points for the output.

Conditions for course completion:

The condition for the grade in the course is active participation in class and obtaining a sufficient number of points for the interim assessment (activity in meetings, study of assigned texts) and the final assessment (the final semester-long oral examination). The final grade for the course will be calculated based on the sum of the midterm and final assessment scores. The student is allowed a maximum of two absences. In the case of more than two absences, the student does not meet the requirements for successful completion of the course. In the event of any attendance problems, the student shall, on his/her own initiative, contact the lecturer with information about his/her absence. The course is taught primarily in a face-to-face format, supplemented by distance learning tools. Opportunity to earn points towards the grade for activity during class. Final assessment: The final assessment will take the form of an oral examination (max. 20 points; min. 12 points). The dates of the exams will be announced in the academic information system in due course. Interim Assessment: In the seminar sessions of the course, students will present in pairs on a selected issue related to modern democracies and discuss/analyze key substantive issues together. The student receives a interim assessment from two activities - the presentation of the selected issue and a semester-long activity during the discussions. Presentation of issues and discussion of their respective subject content will be carried out according to the "Seminar Schedule" table. Preparation and delivery of the presentation and activity during the discussions is a condition for the student's admission to the course examination. In the event that a student repeatedly fails to demonstrate activity during the discussion (or fails to present the topic according to the requirements), the student will be given an assignment in the form of a seminar paper at the end of the semester. Students will send their presentation to both lecturers at least 12 hours prior to the seminar. To be admitted to the examination, students must obtain a minimum of 12 points in the continuous assessment. Students study the assigned text material during the semester as instructed.

Learning outcomes:

Acquisition of a comprehensive knowledge of democracy issues and approaches to its study. Upon completion, students will be able to distinguish not only the core terms and concepts related to democracy, but also to interpret aspects of democracy and democratic decision-making. They will be able to explain and compare ideological concepts and their impact on the actual performance of various policies in democratic regimes and institutions.

Brief outline of the course:

Freedom, equality and order as dynamics of democratic societies; Ideologies in democracy; Issues of the phenomenon of power; Totalitarianism vs. democracy; Deliberative democracy and its models; Epistemic democracy and its models; Defensive democracy, delegative democracy, illiberal democracy; Postdemocracy; Challenges of contemporary democracies; Radical democratic currents
