Conditions for course completion: The conditions for passing the course are as follows: 1. Active participation in exercises. Max. the missed range is 90 min. 2. Submission of the reflection on the selected topic within the specified time. Reflection topic: My strengths and weaknesses in conflict management. In a short presentation of their reflection, in the form of deconstruction, students will describe their strengths and weaknesses in the management of conflict situations with a focus on the application of knowledge, skills and competences needed in conflict situations in the work environment and the school environment. The evaluation of the course and its subsequent completion will be based on clearly and objectively set requirements, which will be set in advance and will not change. The aim of the assessment is to ensure an objective and fair mapping of the student's knowledge while adhering to all ethical and moral standards. There is no tolerance for students' fraudulent behavior, whether in the teaching process or in the assessment process.	
Learning outcomes: Successful mastery and demonstration of knowledge in the field of conflict management and control of basic rules. The method of teaching the subject will be oriented to the student. Lecturers will be interested in students' needs, expectations and opinions so as to encourage them to think critically by expressing respect and feedback on their opinions and needs. The content of the curriculum will be based on primary and high-quality sources that will reflect the topicality of the topics so as to ensure the connection of the curriculum with other subjects and also the connection of the curriculum with practice. Students will be expected to take an active approach in lectures and seminars with an emphasis on their independence and responsibility. The student is able to demonstrate an understanding of an individual's behavior in various conflict situations. The student is able to describe, explain and evaluate their own internal resources, competencies as well as limitations and weaknesses that are directly related to conflict management. The student is able to apply theoretical knowledge and principles of conflict resolution to everyday situations. After completing the course, students will be able to: a) express and summarize basic knowledge related to conflict management; b) understand the basic rules and dynamics of the origin, course	

and termination of the conflict; c) apply knowledge in practice, e.g. in the school environment; d) apply key competencies that increase the possibilities of their application in all areas of practice with a special focus on the work of a teacher. They will acquire knowledge from the theory of conflict management as well as capabilities and competences for solving them, e.g. in the context of school teams.

Disputes and their causes (Types of disputes, External influences, Be able to reveal the causes of disputes), Dispute origin (Levels of disputes, Escalation warning signals, Escalation removal strategies, Know how to explain escalation stages; How do I approach a dispute?)
